What is a 'Unit Block'?

- unit blocks are a construction toy made from solid wood
- unit blocks fit together neatly to form geometric patterns



You can help your child by being interested in their Block Play and asking them what they have built.

Talk to them about different types of buildings you see around the town!

come into nursery to see the Block Play area – why not build alongside your child

What do children learn from 'block play'

Blocks are perhaps the best example of 'unstructured' toys. This kind of play is important because;

it allows the children to exercise their imagination



- it allows children to demonstrate creativity
 and self-expression
- it allows children to design and create detailed and elaborate constructions



- it allows children to explore mathematical concepts
- it allows children to develop mathematical vocabulary



* it allows children to develop problem solving skills
