At KingsWellies Nursery, we believe that community is about coming together, giving back and teaching our children that even the smallest acts of kindness can make a big difference. Our fundraising has been a true community effort. We have encouraged our children and families to get involved in creative and meaningful ways, ensuring that our youngest members understand the importance of kindness, generosity and helping others. We still have our annual Christmas Jumper Day ahead, as well as our registration for Mission Christmas, giving our children, families, staff and wider community the opportunity to donate gifts to children who may otherwise receive very little this Christmas.

Little Feet, Big Achievements

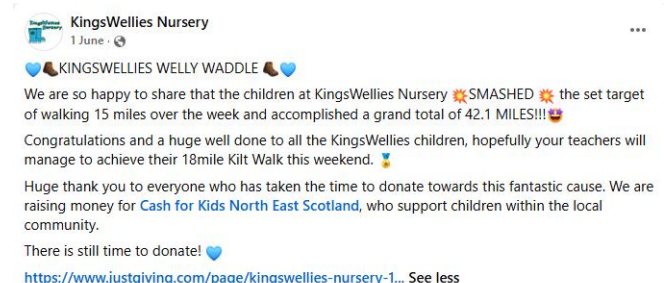
One of our proudest moments this year was our Wellies Waddle, held in May 2026. We set our children a challenge: together, across the nursery week, could they walk 15 miles? With their families and friends sponsoring them, the children embraced the challenge with incredible enthusiasm.

And they didn't just reach their target — they absolutely smashed it!

Our children collectively walked an amazing 42.1 miles, nearly three times our original target. What made this achievement so special was that it was about so much more than the distance. It brought children, parents, grandparents, family members and friends together around a shared purpose. Our children experienced first-hand that when a community works together, we can achieve far more than we ever could alone.

Inspired by the children's incredible achievement, our dedicated staff team decided to take on their own challenge and registered for the Aberdeen Kiltwalk.

On Sunday 7th June 2026, our staff walked an incredible 18 miles, completing the challenge in just six hours and taking an astonishing 45,000 steps along the way.



But once again, it wasn't just our staff who made this special.

Our community of families, friends and supporters gathered at Duthie Park to cheer us across the finish line. Seeing familiar faces waiting for us, celebrating our achievement and sharing in the moment was incredibly emotional. Receiving our medals surrounded by the people who had supported us throughout the journey was a powerful reminder of what community truly means.

It was a moment filled with pride, belonging, togetherness and genuine community spirit — and one that our staff and families will remember for a long time.

Giving Back, Together

Our relationship with Cash for Kids has been incredibly rewarding. We were delighted to receive a heartfelt thank-you from their team, along with a presentation of our fundraising total on a big cheque, which was proudly shared across social media.

For us, however, the biggest reward has been seeing our children understand that their actions can have a real impact on the lives of other children in our local community.

Our journey doesn't end here. We are already looking at ways to continue working with Cash for Kids North East Scotland and are excited about creating even more opportunities for our nursery community to give back.
