As always, we have some summer staff who have been helping us out this year. Our staff also really enjoy helping out across all sites. This is great for sharing good practice and developing professional dialogue.




Children are also becoming more involved in the recruitment process as we ask candidates to read them a story or complete an activity with them. We then ask our children and candidates for their feedback. This is working well.

Recently we have welcomed lovely new staff to join our growing KingsWellies team!



Chloe Fraser has recently moved upstairs to join the Wellie Badger room. We are delighted to have her.


We would also like to wish Megan from the Wellie Badgers room all the very best on her new adventure. She is starting University to become a Primary Teacher but will continue to work

Here are some suggestions to help prepare your child for starting school in August 2025:

🐥 Do they recognise their own name? If not make a sign together for their room and where they hang their jacket at home, so that they are used to seeing it.

- 🌞 If you are going to teach them to write their name please only teach the first letter as a capital. If they learn their whole name in capitals, it then takes time for them to unlearn it. The capital / upper case letter is called the "name" and the lower case letter is called the "sound".
- They will not have the same child: staff ratios as in nursery. One teacher with up to 30 / 33 children. Encourage them to be as independent and resilient as possible, from now.

🔆 Remember school is different from when you went, they will be unlikely to have their own desk but they will be very used to the set-up as it's similar to Nursery.

- Label EVERYTHING!
- Encourage them to open their own snacks so that they are able to do it at playtime and lunchtime.
- Velcro shoes are best!
- Don't share your concerns with them and don't talk about how they are your baby and they aren't ready! They are taking their lead from you!
- 🔆 Can they put on their own jacket and zip it up? If not, start encouraging them now!
- Can they use the toilet independently and wash and dry their hands independently? Now is the time to work on this.
- When you find out their gym days it's best not to put them in shirt and tie on these days.
- 📈 In Scotland all P1s-P3's get a free lunch. When you get a menu, pop it somewhere in the house and let them know what the choices are each day and decide what they will have together.
- 🐺 👎 P1 teachers are angels in disguise, we promise you can trust them with your children! 🥰

- Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing are the responsibility of ALL nursery and school practitioners. We have LOTS of exciting learning opportunities planned for our Wellies Gang!

#### Nappies and Toilet Training

We are making a plea to ALL parents to please support us in ensuring that your children are fully toilet trained by the time that they move into the pre-school rooms (aged three years). Whilst we fully appreciate that all children are individuals, the toddler stage is the most appropriate age for this training milestone to happen. Once in the older rooms, children become much more aware of themselves and wearing nappies can lead to embarrassment. We also really want to focus on lots of high-quality learning and teaching with our older children. Nappy changing takes staff away from this very important part of their job. Our staff are ALL here to help you with this very important milestone. Nappies are also only supplied by us until children reach 3 years old. Parents must then supply their own. Please don't hesitate to discuss with us and we will provide our full support.

#### Aberdeen City Council Pre-School Funding – Session 2025/26 – 1140 hours

As per Kerryn's previous emails, Wellies Nurseries will continue to provide the 1140 FREE hours from August 2025. **This equates to 30 hours per week over 38 weeks of the year.** Please ensure that you read ALL of the 1140-hour funding information that we send you. We are constantly inundated with queries around this. We provide you with this so that you can adequately plan your finances. There should therefore be no surprises.





Regardless whether we work a 38-week model (which we do), a 46-week model or 50-week model, you ALL receive exactly the SAME amount of free hours and funding across the year. It is up to you to choose the nursery and pattern that suits you best. All parents are expected to pay their own invoices out with the free funded period. We also only accept children who are with us for 52 weeks of the year. We do not accept term-time children only. There is no exception to this. Many thanks.

#### Messy Children are Happy Children

As always, we have been playing outside as much as possible. Water walls, water slides, mud kitchens, shaving foam, playdough, construction, messy play, painting, planting and allotments, loose play, minibeast hunts, hedgehog preservation, picnics, forest schools, eco schools, park visits and so much more! We are having so much fun but sorry if we come home a bit messy!





I would also like to reiterate that ALL of our children are outside every day in all weathers. This includes our Wellie Jellies. The Wellie Jellies do not have direct access to our playground. However, they come to the playground daily, have direct access to the forecourt and spend lots of time out and about in our local community. They have exactly the same opportunities as our other KingsWellies children. This is not in question and never has been.

#### **Wellies Nurseries Policies of the Month**

If you would like to review any of our Policies, please get in touch and we will send you a digital copy immediately. We have a huge range of Operational and Curricular Polices which are reviewed on an ongoing basis. These are used to support staff with their daily routines and have all been agreed in consultation with Care Inspectorate and Aberdeen City Council. These can be found in folders within reception areas, outside rooms and within each room. Just ask a staff member. As always, your feedback will shape our future priorities for improvement.

We have also almost finalised our Improvement Plans for Session 25/26. We will send these out to all parents and stakeholders within the next couple of weeks. All Senior Managers have worked hard on completing these and have also taken into account your feedback, comments, compliments and concerns over the last session. 




